Using the Foundation framework, PHP and HTML5, I was able to bring Superfrog's website into the mobile first generation of the web.

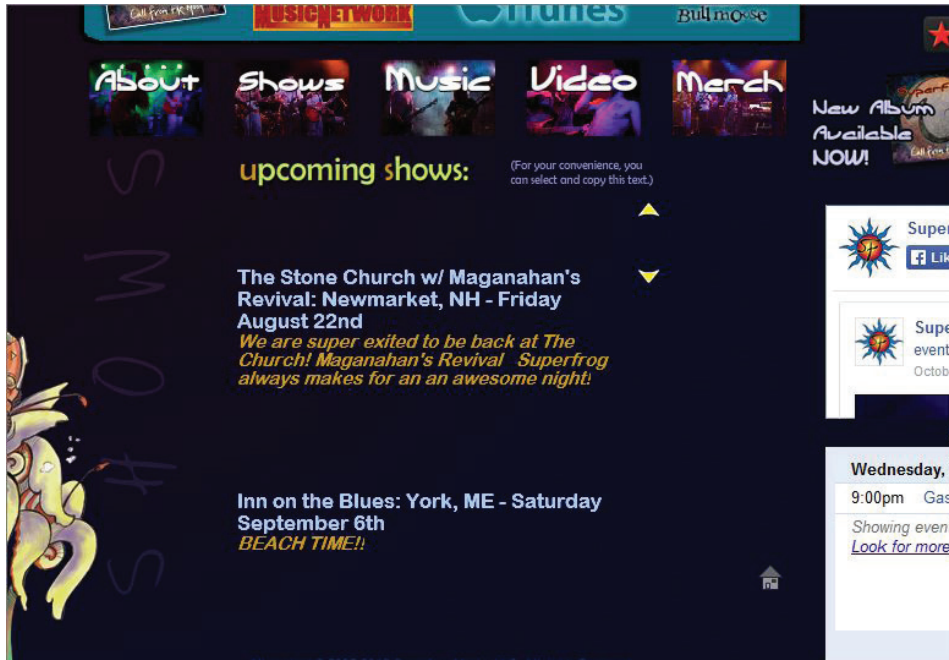

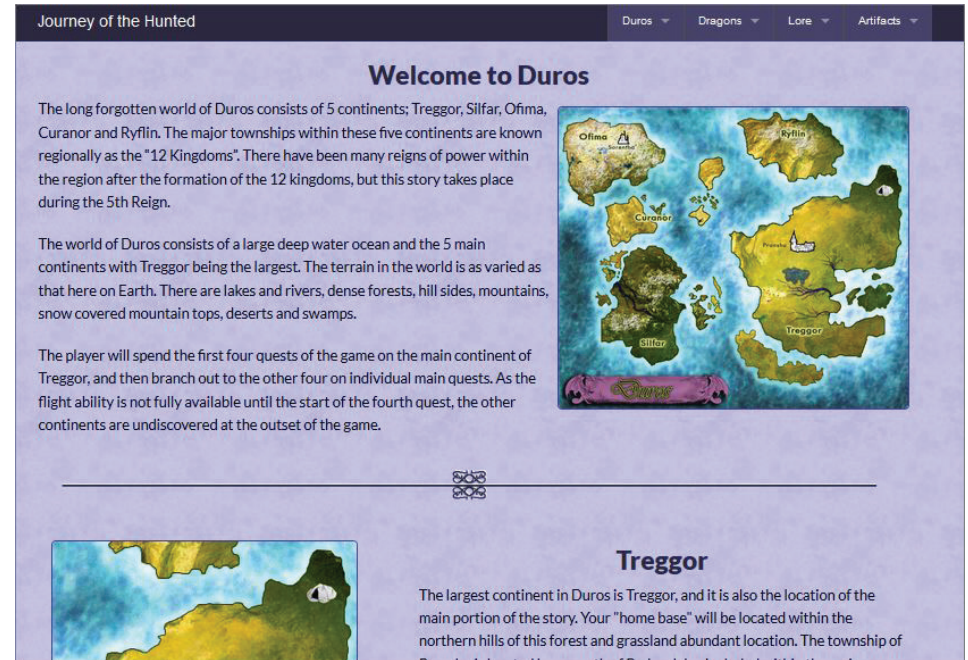

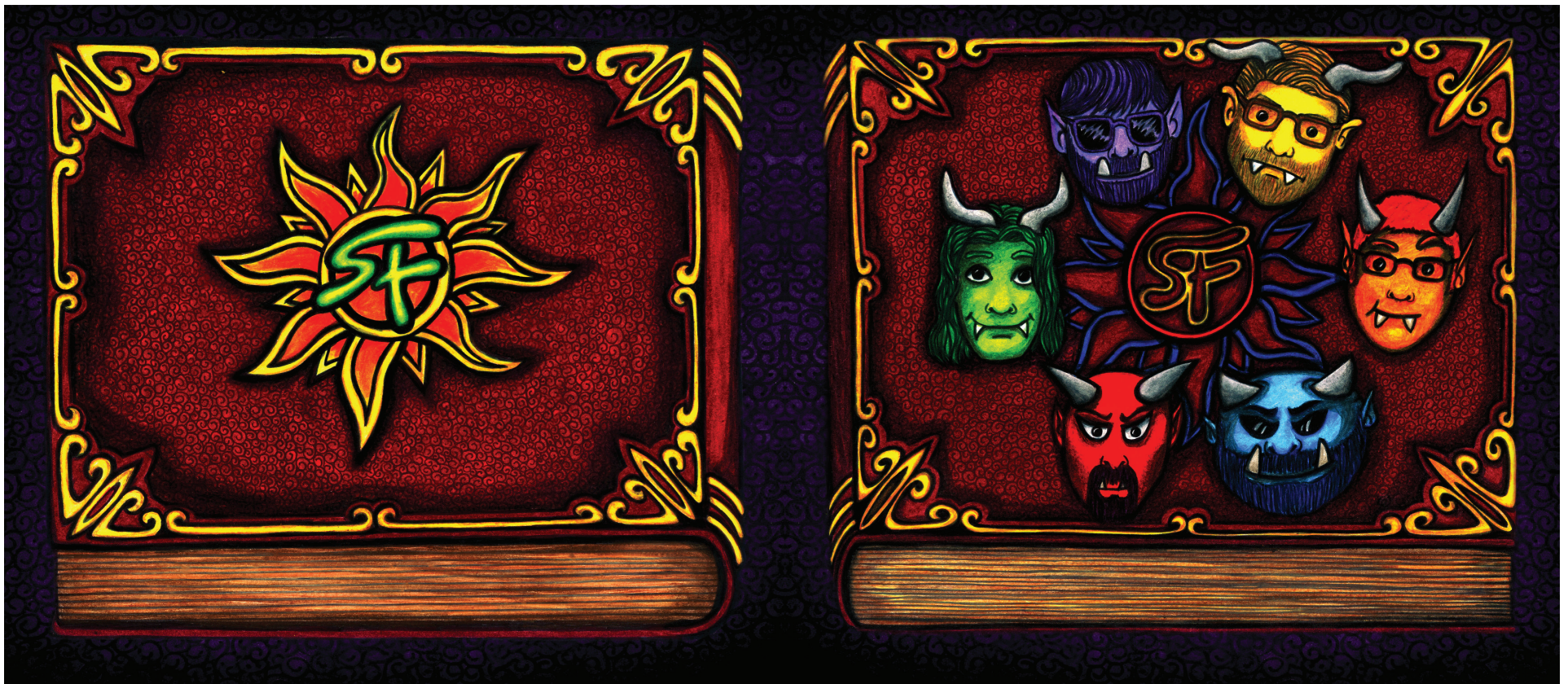
